

NATURE OF THE GAME COLLEGE & PROFESSIONAL TOUR



The Peripheral Vision™ program's 2009 Nature of the Game College and Professional Tour ("Tour") was a great success. Participants described their experience as "amazing," "educational" and "life-changing." Ten student athletes representing Dorsey and Morningside high schools took a red eye flight from Los Angeles to New York on August 11, 2009, arriving at JFK airport the next morning, August 12, 2009.

In spite of a little jet lag, the group ventured out to explore New York City. The first day, would be one of leisure (The Apollo Theater and BBQ's) and preparation for what would prove to be an intense, fast-paced schedule.

Participants met with executives and administrators from the NFL, NBA, Morgan Stanley, MLB, Columbia



University, MLB Players Association and National Basketball Players Association. They also attended the EBC Rucker Semi Finals, toured the Stock Exchange, Empire State Building and the Statue of Liberty.

From New York, participants traveled to Philadelphia to the Wharton School of Business where they were treated to a tour of the campus, a taste of Philly lunch (water ice, cheese steaks, pretzels, etc.) a career workshop and endorsement negotiation exercise.

Next on the schedule was a visit to the Liberty Bell, a lesson on the motor Sports Industry by the Urban Youth Racing School and a stroll on South Street.

The last city on the tour was Washington, D.C. In route, the group made a stop in Baltimore, Maryland, where they met with administrators and toured Morgan State University. While touring in Washington, D.C. they visited the Library of Congress and Capitol Hill, Georgetown University, Howard University, Lincoln Memorial The Mall and the White House. The participants met with executives from the NFL Players Association and received a lesson on sports and Intellectual Property at George Washington University. On August 23, 2009, the participants returned to Los Angeles after 12 fun-filled, exciting and educational days on the east coast.

REFLECTIONS BY TYREE LANDRUM



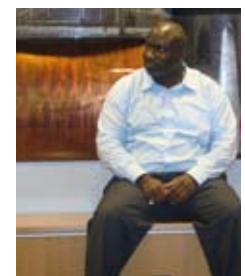
